Hello Brothers and Sisters,

I would again like to thank the members for the continued support. Through your efforts the Union Hall is now paid off, saving Local 876 membership roughly \$120,000.00 in interest payments by paying it off early. Local 876 is also looking good to hit our financial goals before the projected time frame. 876 members also approved funding for our RENEW Committee. That allowed us to host our first Recognition Dinner back in November. It was held at the Soaring Eagle Casino in a formal setting, and allowed us to show how much we appreciate our retirees, along with being able to have a graduation for our new Journeyman. The dinner was well received. I was honored to be able to take part. In February, due to all the issues revolving around the new online system that ALBAT is now utilizing, Local 876 Executive Board officers along with myself went down to the NECA and National Training Alliance to voice the concerns from the membership. This was one of the most useful conferences we have attended

up to this point. This was a real learning experience not only about the apprenticeship, but also learning about many of the new initiative and technologies rolling out soon and how it can impact the industry. The ALBAT Trustees also appreciated the feedback and learning ways they can improve the program. The Negotiations for the 6-876-A outside power agreement for March 23rd have been canceled due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Our April 8th date is yet to be determined. Since January of 2019, we have had 286 new members that have come to the hall to swear in at the general membership meetings. Congrats to all the new members and we welcome you to come to future meetings.


Lineman's Rodeo

If you have a Michigan driver's license or state ID card, you can register to vote online. Start the process at Michigan.gov/Vote.

Complete this form to register to vote or update your registration information¹.



Please print all information clearly using black or blue pen.

Mail or drop off the form to your city/township clerk.

Find your city/township clerk and more information at Michigan.gov/Vote.

Phone number/email provided will be used for official election purposes only.

¹Name changes must be completed at an SOS branch office.



The voter registration deadline is 15 days before election day, IF you submit this form through a voter registration drive or deliver it to a county clerk or secretary of state office. If you mail the form, it must be postmarked at least 15 days before the election.



You can register any time up through Election Day by going to your city or township clerk office with residency verification.

If you have a Michigan driver's license (DL) or state identification card (SID), you must use the same address for voter registration and DL/SID.

This form will also change your DL/SID address. You'll be mailed a sticker with your new address to put on your DL/SID.

If you have never voted in person in Michigan and choose to submit this form by mail or through a voter registration drive, review the instructions on page 1. You might need to provide additional ID.
